The Natural Resources Department-Livestock Inspectors Office has been monitoring the Marana Stockyards & Livestock Auction website. Currently all Wednesday Auctions are to continue to be held as scheduled. As a response to COVID-19 Marana Stockyards has had to implement temporary restrictions in order to continue business operations, these include:

- Grandstand will be limited to registered buyers and essential personnel only.
- No spectators are allowed in the viewing area until further notice. Viewing can take place through cattleusa.com
- Only one member of a buyer's party is to be represented in the viewing area, this including family members.
- All buyers are to maintain safely distant while in the viewing area.

In support of the Tohono O'odham Nation Livestock Owners, Livestock Associations, and Range Bosses, the Natural Resources Department-Livestock Inspectors Office has remained open with a single Livestock Inspector on duty during regular business hours, 8:00 am. to 5:00 pm., and is responding to Livestock Inspections for cattle to be transported to the Auction.

The Inspectors Office shall continue to be notified of Intended Organized Round-Ups by Livestock Owners, Livestock Associations, and Range Bosses by calling the office at (520) 383-3233. Please leave a message.

The organized round-ups and cattlemen must adhere to all safety precautions, by limiting round ups to smaller groups of no more than 10 cattlemen, and socially distancing themselves from other cattlemen for the health and safety of all members.

Livestock matters will be monitored on a weekly basis and will evolve as the COVID-19 Health Crisis Pandemic evolves.
